 Review the Amazing Words and have children use them to talk about the selection. Discuss the text features an author might use to organize information in a nonfiction text. 	Theme and Knowledge Demands If children have difficulty with the complex sentence structure, reread a difficult sentence and discuss with children any unknown words. Language Conventionality and Clarity If children have difficulty understanding the proximity of China to where they live, locate both places on a world map. Have them measure the distance with a string. Help children use the mileage ruler on the map to estimate the difference.
