READER AND TASK SUGGESTIONS		
Preparing to Read the Text	Leveled Tasks	
 Review the long a sound of vowel patterns a, ai, and ay. Discuss that folk tales often have animal characters that act like human beings. 	Structure If children have trouble understanding dialogue, have them identify text and punctuation that provide clues each time a different character is speaking.	
 Remind children that as they encounter unfamiliar words, they may need to read more slowly and think about context clues to better understand the text. 	Language Conventionality and Clarity If children do not struggle with humor and irony, have them identify examples of each in the text.	

Recommended Placement Both the qualitative and quantitative measures suggest this text should be placed in the Grade 2–3 text complexity band, which is where both the Common Core State Standards and *Scott Foresman Reading Street* have placed it.
