| | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Review the use of a dictionary and glossary to find meanings for unfamiliar words. Discuss how authors use dialogue in plays and organize the story into scenes. Remind students that they may need to adjust their reading rate to better understand the action in the play. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Levels of Meaning • Synthesis Students may have difficulty understanding what makes this play a myth. Have them read the narrator's speech on p. 423. Ask them to identify what it explains in nature. Structure If students have difficulty keeping the dialogue and characters straight, assign each of them a role to play, and have the group read aloud. |

Recommended Placement Generally the qualitative and quantitative measures suggest this text should be placed in the Grade 2–3 text complexity band, which is where both the Common Core State Standards and *Scott Foresman Reading Street* have placed it. Some students will benefit from scaffolded support for unfamiliar words.
