	Preparing to Read the Text	Leveled Tasks
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Review strategies for understanding homonyms. Refer to the vocabulary strategy lesson on p. 54e. Discuss with students the purpose of exaggeration in tall tales. Remind students that as they encounter unfamiliar words, they should read more slowly and think about how each word is used in the sentence. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Theme and Knowledge Demands Students may already have a basic knowledge of frontier times or cattle ranching. As they read, have them consider why so many tall tales take place in the Old West. Discuss as a class. Language Conventionality and Clarity Students may have difficulty with vocabulary in the selection. Remind them to check for context clues and familiar roots.

Recommended Placement Both the qualitative and quantitative measures suggest this text may be challenging for some students at this level. Some students may need scaffolded support to work through some of the longer sentences, figurative language, and the unfamiliar context of the story. With support, students should be able to access the content of this selection.
